Registration will be through the student portal URSA. To register, you will need to have a UNC student account. If you've previously attended UNC, in any capacity, you will have an existing student account. If you have never attended UNC, you'll need to create a student account. Course Description:

ART 513 is provided by the University of Northern Colorado to Update skills and knowledge of professionals in the discipline. Goals and objectives will be specifically directed at individual professional enhancement rather than the acquisition of general discipline knowledge or methodologies. This course will require participants to explore the themes presented at the 2024 Teaching for Artistic Behavior Conference with further readings, research, practical implementation of ideas, and reflexive writings.

In this two-day workshop, participants will be introduced to Teaching for Artistic Behavior (TAB), also known as Choice-Based Art Education, which is a style of teaching that emphasizes individual strengths and fosters creativity in carefully constructed environments designed for student-directed learning.

The 2024 conference will cover Introduction of the Teaching for Artistic Behavior Philosophy for newcomers

and discussions examining new directions and applications for experienced TAB teachers.

Keynote presentations: Kelly Beach Dale Zalmstra

Concepts will include advocacy for TAB methods of teaching, practical ideas for implementation of learning based on student choice, use of contemporary art in a TAB classroom, creating inclusive learning environments in person or online, the role of play and innovation in at home learning, and time envisioning new directions. The conference will include break-out sessions for newcomers, experienced TAB teachers, and different grade levels.

Objectives:

Participants will demonstrate an evolving understanding of TAB, and the choice model classroom and Colorado Academic Art Standards

Participants will utilize opportunities for sharing information, ideas, and resources among teachers interested student-directed learning

Participants will reflect on current effective practices and envision innovative learning and studio spaces and imaginative artmaking opportunities including:

inclusive practices reflecting on current societal biases.

"Inquiry –based" teaching and its role in supporting student voice.

Expanded concept of the artists' studio, where artists utilize resources outside the classroom

Reflection on how contemporary artists practice a variety of artmaking processes to respond to global concerns and tell personal stories.

Course Requirements:

- 1. Attend the Teaching for Artistic Behavior conference. Include a log of sessions attended.
- 2. Use this course to examine for yourself the variety of artistic practices acknowledged now. Watch at least three ART 21 interviews that expand your own ideas https://art21.org/
- 3. Recommended: You may also want to reference the following TAB teacher Blog teachingforartisticbehavior.org http://teachingforartisticbehavior.org/blog.html
- 4. Write a one-page reflection on the conference, identifying new ideas, reflections and visions of "artistic behavior" for the classroom or personally.
- 5. Document the implementation in the classroom of one new idea or teaching strategy from your reflections or from conversations and presentations at the conference. You may show your implementation of the idea by a digital presentation with a brief explanation or in a three-page paper.

Step 1: Activate Ursa Account

Registration is accessed through Ursa, UNC's online single point of access to secure information and tools. You can use Ursa to manage registration, view grades, order transcripts, view and pay student bills, complete forms and more.

If you have NOT previously taken a UNC course or been admitted to UNC...

- 1. Please create your UNC account via the UNC non-degree-seeking application at https://admissions.unco.edu/account/register. On the UNC Application...
 - Follow the directions to register your account.
 - Once your account is created, "Start New Application" and choose "...Nondegree seeking."
- Once you submit the non-degree-seeking application, it may take 48-72 hours to
 process your information. You will receive a confirmation email with your Bear Number
 and Bearmail (email) address. This email will go to the email address you provided on
 the Bear Application. All further UNC correspondence goes to your secure Bearmail
 account. It is important you know how to access it.
- 3. Activate your Ursa account: directions are available at https://apps.unco.edu/aboutursa/ (click "Account Activation Instructions").
- 4. Once your account is activated (this may take up to 30 minutes) you can log onto Ursa: https://ursa.unco.edu/ to login, enter your Username/PDID (provided during your account activation) and the password you chose.

If you have attended UNC, but not within the last 12 months...

- 1. Your student account must be reactivated by completing the online Student Information Form: https://apps.unco.edu/StudentInformationForm/
 Processing may take up to 24 hours to process the Student Information Form. A confirmation email is sent once the student record has been created.
- Re-activate your Ursa account: directions are available at https://apps.unco.edu/aboutursa/ (click "Account Activation Instructions").

If you have attended UNC in the last 12 months...

Sign into Ursa (https://ursa.unco.edu/) with your username and password, then skip to the Register for Your Course steps below.

- If you do not remember your password, click on "Password Reset" and follow the directions
- If you receive the following message "your account has been disabled due to inactivity" please use the "If you have attended UNC, but not within the last 12 months..." directions above.

Step 2: Activate UNC BearMail

Note: BearMail is your student email system. All correspondence from UNC is sent to your secure BearMail account. Please check it often.

You can access your BearMail from within Ursa or by visiting http://bears.unco.edu.

- The first part of your BearMail address will be the same as your Ursa username [first four characters of your last name and a randomly chosen 4-digit number (e.g. smit1234@bears.unco.edu or fox4321@bears.unco.edu)].
- Your password is the same as your Ursa password.


- 1. Sign into Ursa at https://ursa.unco.edu/
